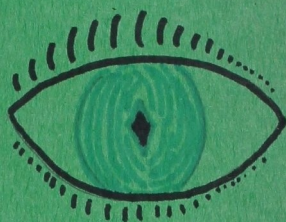

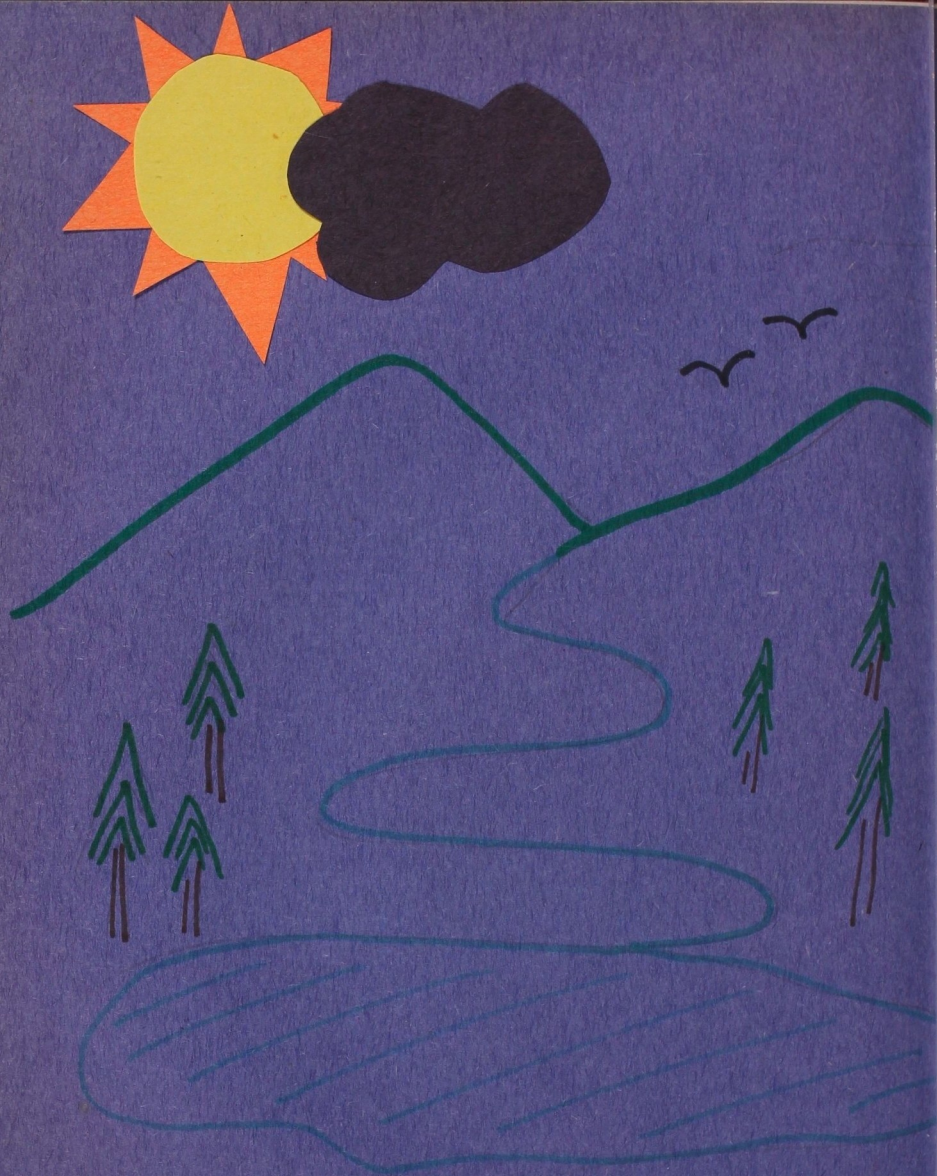

June 24, 1991

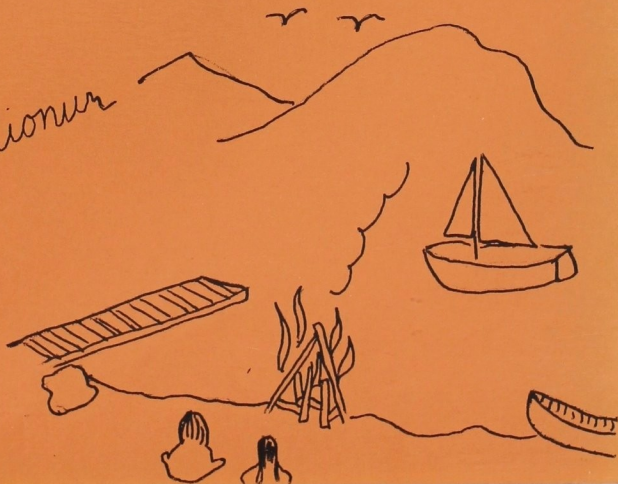

Rome teen-ager studies mice

Praises program at Jackson Laboratory

ROME — While most 16-year-old girls might find something else more exciting to study than a lab full of mice, to Janet Alter, spending the summer at the Jackson Laboratory was a dream come true.

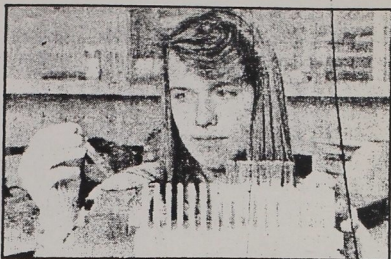
Alter, daughter of Becky and Peter Alter of Rome, was part of a team of summer students who recently completed a 10-week special studies program at the Bar Harbor lab, which is the world's leading mammalian genetic research facility.

Working with her sponsor, Dr. Gordon Watson, Alter completed a ground-breaking series of experiments researching mouse gene regulation in preparation for a project paper which she presented during a Jackson Laboratory symposium at the end of the course.

Alter is a senior at Messalonskee High School. She was one of 27 students selected nationwide from a field of more than 400 candidates to participate in summer research at the lab. The program has been held at the facility for over 50 years.

Alter's eyes light up as she talks about learning of the program from high school science teacher Paul Nelson, who gave her a pamphlet.

"He said, 'you should try this with the Jackson Laboratory, it's great, great, great,'" she said, bubbling with enthusiasm. "I read over it and instantly, I

was hooked."

"I've always loved biology," she added. "Science has always been my best subject."

Alter is at the top of her class at Messalonskee High School, according to Principal Carroll Thompson. She presently is taking four advanced placement courses, including physics, calculus, U.S. history, and English.

Next fall, she hopes to attend Williams College in Massachusetts. Her goal eventually is to earn a doctorate and enter the field of biological research, or to become a biology teacher.

While at the Jackson Laboratory, Alter focused on mammalian genetics using mice, which the lab is

known for the world over. It was her job to study the beta-glucuronidase gene, an enzyme that breaks down sugars within the bodies of many mammals.

Alter explained that researchers now are in the process of studying genes one at a time, because if they know how one gene works, often the research can be applied to other genes.

To conduct her experiment, Alter was given 99 mice by her sponsor Watson, who had a question he wanted answered, and a specific project which he hoped would do the job.

"What I did was take the mice, and because beta-glucuronidase is regulated by testosterone, I cut a little hole in the backs of their necks and inserted a pellet of testosterone," she explained. "It was really amazing to watch the effects of just one hormone, 'cause these are female mice, and I'm giving them testosterone (the male sex hormone)."

"At the beginning, you always had to watch out in case they were going to bite you, but after they'd had the testosterone for about three weeks they were about ready to rip your hand off. They were really mean, they got really aggressive."

"This is more testosterone than a male would have, so they were even meaner than the males," she continued. "They were not nice mice. But when they didn't have the testosterone they were pretty cute."

At the end of three weeks, the pellet was removed for three days to three weeks. Then the mice were repelleted for three more weeks. At the end of the second three-week period, the mice were killed on different days so that their kidneys could be examined for beta-glucuronidase enzyme activity.

Alter was quick to point out that although the mice made the ultimate sacrifice for the betterment of mankind, they were at all times treated kindly at the lab.

"The sad thing to say is that you really do need to work with live animals," she said. "You have to see what is happening in life, and there are not many people who are willing to say 'oh just experiment on me,' — so unfortunately the animals are the ones that are experimented on."

At the end of the study, Alter compared her results to previously published results of other labs around the world, wrote a project paper, and made an oral presentation of her findings at a Jackson Lab symposium.

While she acknowledged that her research in itself will not end any diseases, it could provide vital information to help scientists down the road in the study of a human disease that afflicts some people, who produce none of this enzyme.

The disease, called muco polysaccharidosis Type VII, can be a fatal defect in human beings, she said. And every little bit of research helps.

"If we can put all of these pieces together, maybe someday in the distant or near-distant future, we can find a way to cure these people," she said.

"My research won't directly cure them, but you can take the information I got and information from other people, put it all together and discover a cure."

Alter enjoyed the summer at the laboratory, and hopes to return another year for further study.

"What I liked the most was the idea was that I was doing real research that no one in the world had ever done before," she said. "I was helping to answer a question that would have great impact on many lives. And, I really want to thank Dr. Watson for allowing me to work in his lab and learn a great deal about genetic research."

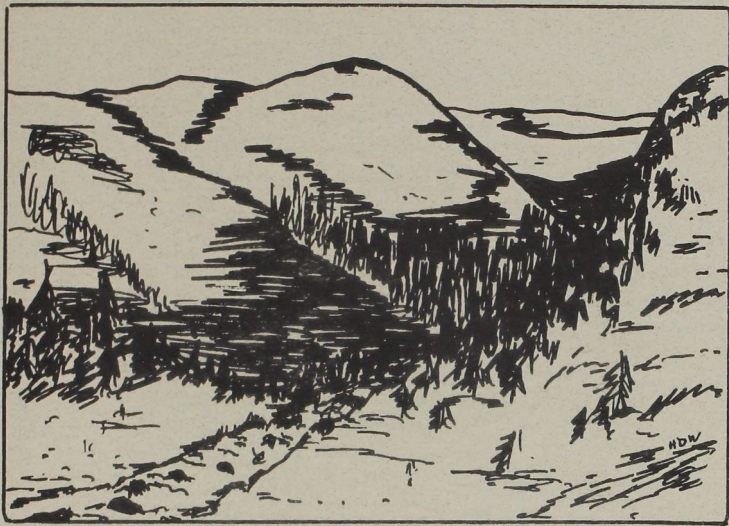
