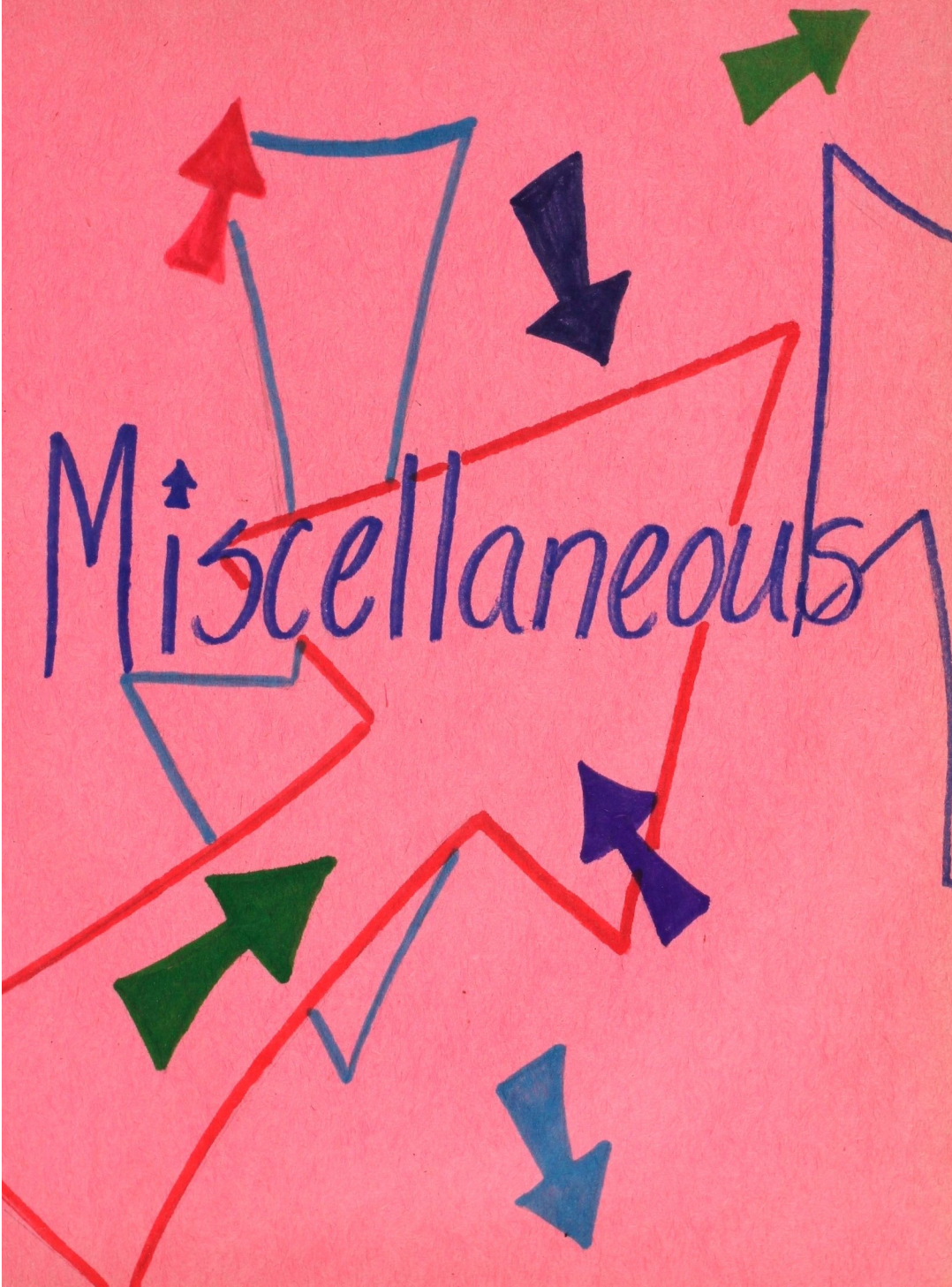


Dear Emily,

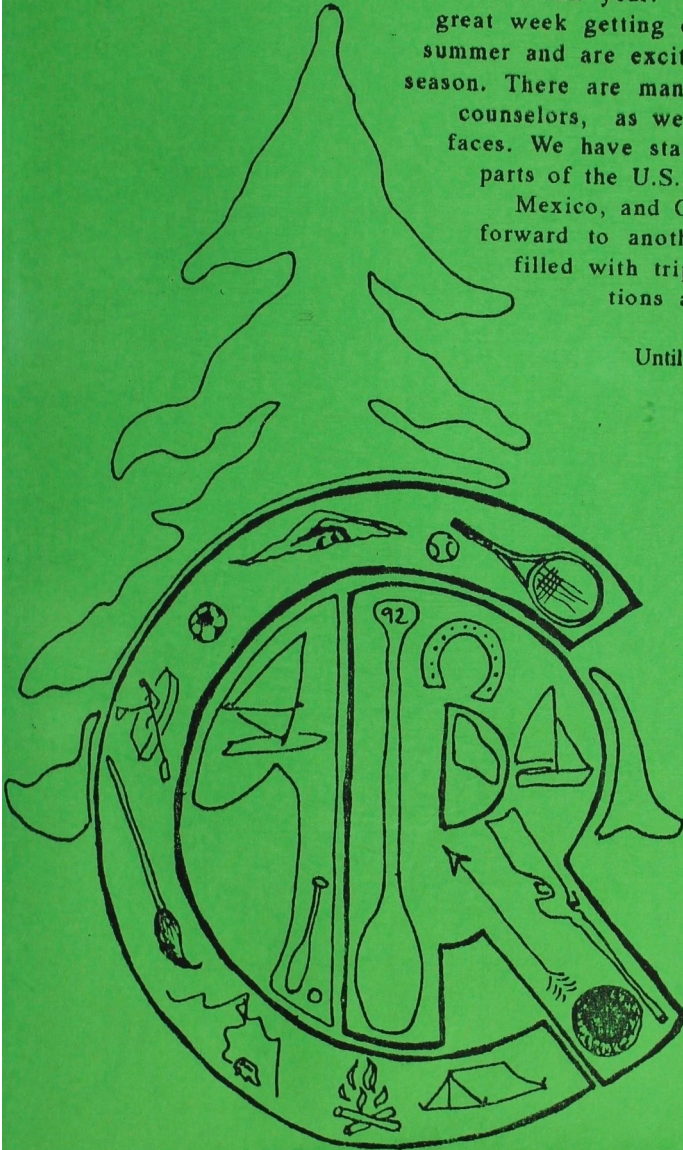
June 28, 1992

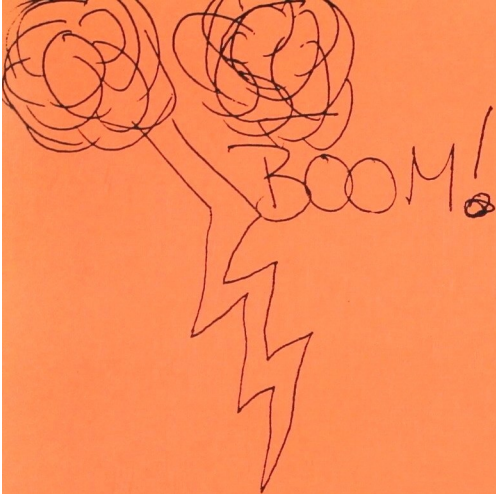

It was hard to say goodbye to those leaving, but what a wonderful session we had; we look forward to seeing all of those same faces next year!!

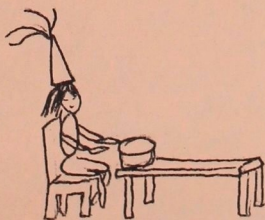
