

"What if it's a whole **Thomas** of dinosaurs?"

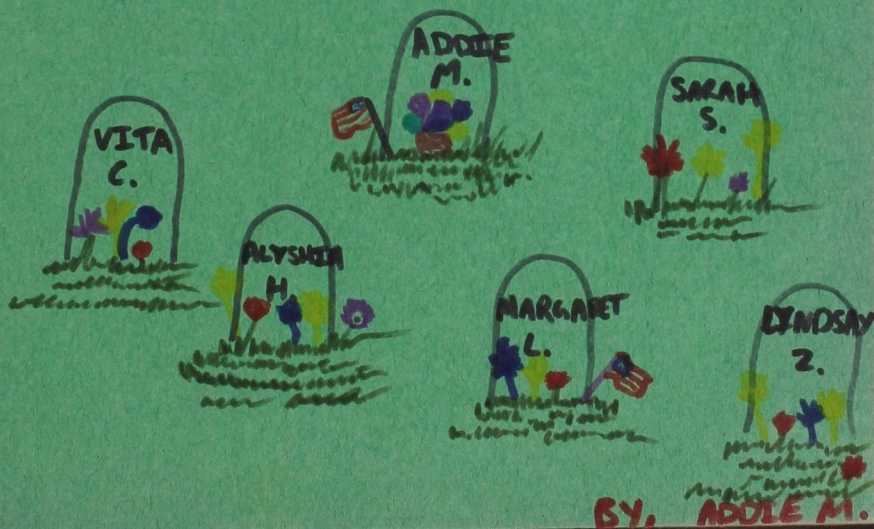
Then everyone spotted a group of baby dinosaurs running and behind them was TyRosenwasser Rex. They were coming straight towards Martin's group.

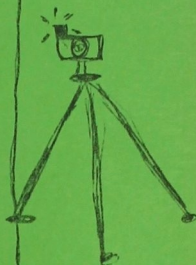
On Thursday it was camp picture day and all of the cabin pictures and roommate pictures were taken. Friday brought us another full day of activities with a beach party in the evening.

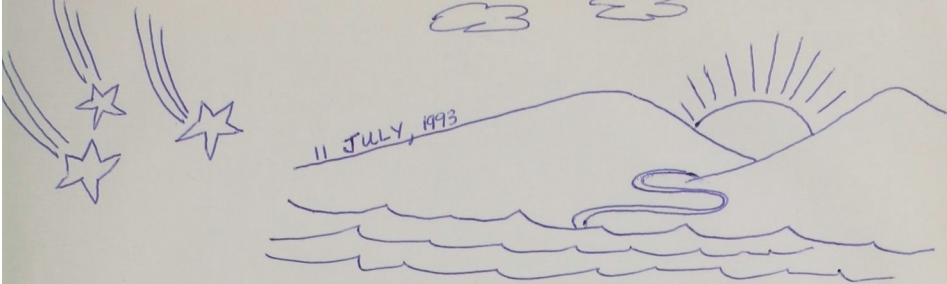

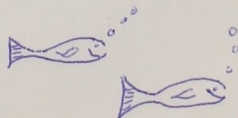
Friday afternoon began our Blue/White competition in softball and kickball. The Junior Blues were victorious in kickball and the Senior Whites won at softball.

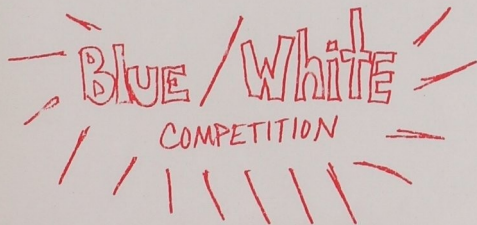
The E.P.'s this week included a counselor hunt, the "Roommate Game", two movies (our concession to the weather) and an assortment of other games. A fun time was had by all.

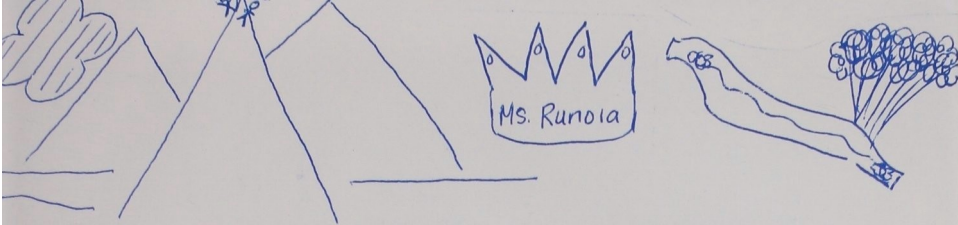

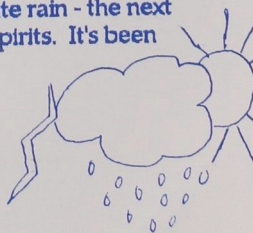
This week the weather has been very inconsistent. One minute rain - the next minute beautiful sunshine. However, nothing can dampen our spirits. It's been a great week.

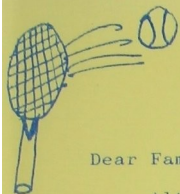
