
KATHRYN ROBERTS - My first impression at camp was I would think I'll like this camp.

Second Shack's Trip to Laura's



We have had some great Evening Programs this week. We've played games like Capture the Flag, Sardines, The Fox and the Hound,


and Giants, Wizards, and Elves.


We have all been having a great time in our activities, trying new things and enjoying old favorites too. We all hope that we will get to try every activity a few times before the end of the summer.




Dear Families,

Wednesday night was our Log Reading night where we heard name poems, trip stories, sang songs, read limericks about each camper and the log staff read silly statistics about each camper.



President Clinton pumped cash into the accounts of Maine Democrats and energy into party activists Monday as he visited Portland to boost the prospects of Democratic candidates in the November election.

Clinton addressed a \$100-a-head reception at the Sonesta Hotel before heading to a \$1,000-a-plate dinner at the Holiday Inn by the Bay. Party leaders estimated that at least 400 people bought tickets to each event.

The president delivered a standard stump speech to about 300 supporters at the Sonesta. He urged his fellow Democrats to back their party's candidates for the U.S. Senate, Congress and the Blaine House and "send a message to America that you are on the side of change."

He unveiled no new initiatives, but tailored his standard campaign pitch to a Maine audience.

Clinton used his 22-minute speech at the Sonesta to review his accomplishments since taking office last year, to rally support for health-care reform and to promote the candidacies of the four Democrats who joined him on the dais.

"We've got a real ethnic blend up here with this ticket," Clinton said before mentioning each candidate by name. The president urged Mainers to send state Senate President Dennis Dutremble and state Sen. John Baldacci to the U.S. House of Representatives, elect U.S. Rep. Thomas Andrews to the U.S. Senate and return Joseph Brennan, a two-term former governor, to the Blaine House.

All four face potentially tough races in November, especially Andrews.

Andrews is believed to be trailing U.S. Rep. Olympia Snowe in their fight to succeed U.S. Sen. George Mitchell, who is not seeking re-election. Dutremble faces Republican James Longley and Baldacci is up against Republican Rep. Richard Bennett in the general election.

"I need them there," Clinton said of Andrews, Dutremble and Baldacci. "More importantly, you need

them there."

Like the Mainers whose candidacies he endorrsed, Clinton faces problems of his own this year. The president's party traditionally loses seats in Congress during mid-term elections, and that is expected to happen this year as well.

In fact, there is a chance that the Republicans will gain control of the Senate, making the nationally watched contest between Andrews and Snowe particularly important to

Clinton singled out Mitchell and Andrews for praise, saying the country is indebted to Mitchell for his work in the Senate. He said Andrews was a key supporter of budget initiatives that narrowly passed Congress. "When the chips were down, Tom Andrews didn't blink." Clinton said.

Although Clinton sold the virtues of Maine's top-of-the-ticket Democrats, he spent much of his speech making the case for a health-care reform package providing universal coverage for all Americans.

The problem, Clinton said, is that one in six Americans is uninsured and most of those who have insurance have no guarantee they will keep it. He said other Western democracies that spend less on health care insure more of their citizens.

"If you're very wealthy, or you're very poor, or you're a politician, or you're in jail, you'll always have health care," Clinton said. "Otherwise, you might lose it."

Building to a highly charged rhetorical finish, Clinton said the nation's political leaders "need to complete a battle that was begun by Franklin Roosevelt and Harry Truman and has never been completed." The federal government "must restrain health-care costs and provide health security to all Americans."

Democrats said Clinton's visit will serve the dual purpose of raising money for Democratic candidates while energizing the candidates and their supporters.

"It's a combination of both of those things," said former state Senate President Charles Pray, who now works for the U.S. Department

of Energy.

Rep. James Bowers, the party treasurer, said the money raised by the reception at the Sonesta will go to a combined Democratic campaign designed to promote all of the party's candidates. Proceeds from the pricier dinner at the Holiday Inn will go to Andrews and Brennan.

"I think this was a great boost for the Democratic Party, a tremendous boost," Richard Little of Portland, a laborer, said after he passed through a reception line at the

Sonesta.

Although the president's visit went smoothly, he managed to ruffle

a few feathers.

Portland Police Chief Michael Chitwood said overtime, planning and other costs forced his department to pay out about \$20,000 for the president's visit. Chitwood said he will ask the Andrews and Brennan campaigns to reimburse his department because "taxpayers are subsidizing this campaign fund-raising

Kenneth Cole, chairman of the Maine Republican Party, also criticized the cost of the trip, which he described as "100 percent political." Noting that the Democratic Party paid only part of the cost of a 1993 Clinton visit to Maine that Cole described as partisan, he said the taxpayers will end up footing much of the bill this time out as well.

A crowd of about 200 people greeted Clinton with a mixture of applause and jeers as the presidential limousine glided toward the

Sonesta.

The crowd was as diverse as it was orderly: A small group of protesters holding signs reading, "Rush is Right" stood shoulder-to-shoulder with a woman whose T-shirt carried the message, "O.J. is innocent until proven guilty."

The scene outside the Holiday Inn was similar. On one side of the street were representatives of United We Stand America, Ross Perot's group. On the other side, a handful of people held signs indicating their dislike for Andrews. A block away was a group from the Aids Coalition To Unleash Power. The ACT-UP demonstrators demanded Clinton's health plan include all Americans.

Clinton and his entourage arrived at the Brunswick Naval Air Station about 6 p.m. and boarded three Marine helicopters that carried them to the Portland Jetport. Arriving there about 6:30 p.m., Clinton emerged from one of the helicopters, followed by Andrews, Brennan and Mitchell.

Belgrade camp gets woodland donated

BELGRADE — Eighteen acres of woodland was donated to Camp Runoia by a real-estate investment firm in Belgrade Lakes.

According to Gail Rizzo, her partners, Frank Rizzo and Patrick Donahue of the Donahue & Rizzo Co., decided to turn over the property to Camp Runoia because they felt there was no need to further develop their new subdivision, Oakwood Estates.

The property, which is located on the Point Road adjacent to Camp Runoia, is to be left in its natural state, with conservation easements to prevent further development.

Camp Runoia owners Phil and Betty Cobb said the donated property will ensure that the camp remains private.

"I think it's wonderful ... it protects us," Betty Cobb said. "You want to protect as much area around an organized camp as possible."

"It keeps the area private and helps protect Oakwood Estates and all the abutting land owners," Phil Cobb said.

"We plan to use it as a tree farm and let it grow up and be forever wild. The whole area will be open to campers."

The Donahue & Rizzo Co., formed in 1991, develops

recreational properties statewide and is currently involved in a 47-lot subdivision known as Riverside Development at Sugarloaf/USA in Carrabassett Valley.

Runoia is open to girls between the ages of 7 and 16 and has been an accredited camp of the American Camping Association since 1960 when the Cobbs purchased it from founder Lucy Weiser

The camp was founded by Weiser and Jessie Pond in 1907.

There are 63 acres of woods and fields, with nearly a mile of shoreline along Great Pond.

Campers who stay at Runoia participate in waterfront activities, horseback riding, mountain climbing, sports, dancing, arts and crafts and a number of other projects to develop their individual abilities.

The Cobbs, who reside at the camp year-round, have spent a combination of over 60 years in organized camping and education.

Their daughter, Pam, a Runoia director, is the fourth generation of the Cobb family to operate camps in Maine.






























Bragado-Darman brings

■ Under a guest baton, the RSO will celebrate cultural diversity.

The Reading Symphony Orchestra will have the rare opportunity of playing under a guest conductor Saturday at 8 p.m. in the Rajah Theatre. Max Bragado-Darman will take the baton in a concert of music by Rodrigo, Ginastera and Rimsky-Korsakov.

With only a half-dozen performances in a season, a music director cannot afford to lose time to work with an orchestra, especially when in the process of building it, as is the case with RSO's director, Sidney Rothstein. Still, having a guest conductor gives the orchestra a chance to experience another person's style and vision – like a chess player meeting the challenge of a new partner.

In keeping with the RSO's new emphasis on cultural diversity, Saturday's program will explore 20th-century Spanish music under a Spanish conductor. Bragadoparman, a native of Madrid and currently music director of the Symphony Orchestra of Queen Sofia and the Symphony Orchestra of Castilla and Leon, is an internationally known advocate of Spanish composers.

Speaking from his home in Valladolid, Spain, Bragado-Darman said there is plenty of music being written in Spain, and, as in most European countries, new music is supported by the government.

."I don't want to name only a few of them, because I don't want to leave anyone out," he said, when asked for a few examples of contemporary composers, but it's a matter of public record that he has conducted works by Tomas "I feel it's part of my duty to premiere new works. Bragado-Darman decided he wanted to be a conductor when, at the age of 12, he heard Ataulfo Argenta, music director of the National Orchestra of Spain from 1945 until his death in 1958, conduct Beethoven's "Emperor" Concerto.

"I asked him afterwards what I should do to become a conductor. He said, 'If you want to study with me you have to prove you're a good pianist.'"

From that day on, Bragado-Darman studied piano seriously, winding up at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Madrid. Two years before he finished his studies there, he heard the Eastman School Philharmonia Orchestra under composer Howard Hanson, on tour in Spain in 1961-62.

"I was enthralled by the sound of that orchestra," he said. "It was fantastic. We didn't have anything like it in Europe. I decided I wanted to go and study at Eastman (in Rochester, N.Y.)."

In 1963, he received a scholar-

ship to study in the United States under an exchange program in which he lived with an American family in Cleveland, Ohio. During that time, he studied piano at the Cleveland Institute of Music and auditioned at Eastman and at the nearby Oberlin Conservatory, where he ultimately chose to study piano under Joseph Schwartz beginning in 1965.

"At that time, coming from Spain, the United States looked like a country in another galaxy," Bragado-Darman said. "I loved my time here, and learned a great deal."

In fact, he married an American from New Jersey, and they have a son born in the United States and a daughter born in Spain.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in piano and a master's degree in conducting from Oberlin, Bragado-Darman undertook further studies in piano and conducting at the University of Michigan School of Music, where he was the assistant conductor of the University of Michigan Orchestra.

While there, he said, he became interested in anthropology and took courses in it, including one given by Napoleon Chagnon, who wrote a classic work on the Yanomamo Indians

of Brazil. In fact, he had already bought a plane ticket to accompany Chagnon on a trip to conduct further studies among these native people. But just before he was to leave, he received an offer to conduct in Nashville.

"So I said goodbye to the Orinoco and took the job," he said. In 1971, he returned to Europe

In 1971, he returned to Europe to study conducting with Franco Ferrara and Igor Markevitch, in 1972, he was a finalist in the International Competition for Conductors at Besancon, France. The following year he returned to the United States to hold a number of conducting positions, including one with the Cleveland Institute. Since then he has conducted throughout the world, and has been music director of the Canary Island Philharmonic Orchestra and director of the Festival de Palma de Majorca.

In January 1986, he debuted as guest conductor of the London Symphony Orchestra. Just prior to his current posts, he was music director of the Concerto Grosso
