DEDICATION

Ninety Years! For many of you that is hard to imagine. Things have changed and much has happened in that amount of time. This summer we have read the Logs written over the years and we have talked about changes in clothing, in activities and the gradual change of traditions. Some of the older traditions have been lost, but each year there is the opportunity to begin a new "tradition."

Ninety years does seem like a long time, but the commitment to camping for women in this family began even before that. In 1890 Charles E. Cobb and his wife opened a camp for girls called Wildwood in Parsonsfield, Maine. In 1902 that camp was moved to Highland Lake in Maine and later to Moose Pond in Denmark, Maine where it was renamed Wyonegonic. The Cobb family owned and operated this camp, along with Winona, a camp for boys, until it was sold in 1970. Meanwhile, the family tradition in camping continued as Betty and Phil Cobb came to Runoia in 1959 and purchased this camp in 1960. The summer of 1996 realizes this continuity as Pamela Cobb has assumed the leadership as the new owner of camp.

Camp Runoia, established in 1907 by Miss Weiser and Miss Pond, has, indeed, had a long history. Many young women have enjoyed a summer here as a camper or a counselor, or both! Camp has given them the opportunity to develop life-time skills, to form friendships that last a lifetime and to nurture a love for the out-of-doors. Women have learned to appreciate and respect each other as they have created the place we know today.

Our traditions are such a strong part of our summers here. Women who return to visit remember songs we still sing today. Many remark that little has changed! Indeed, we walk the same paths, paddle the same routes and experience many of the same emotions as we watch a sunset or sing around a campfire. How fortunate we are that such a strong commitment to women has been made.

This commitment is a continuing one. Our stationery boasts of America's oldest camping family. I think we can very proudly sing our traditional birthday song for Camp Runoia's ninetieth birthday...

"I thought I heard my grandmother say
That Runoia's birthday was today
With a fee fo, and a fi fo
And a fee fo, fi fo fum
And a ring tail, rang tail, hanging on a cat's tail
Sis, boom, ba...
Runoia, Runoia, rah, rah, rah!"

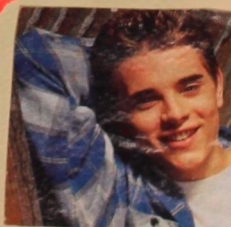

We will always make

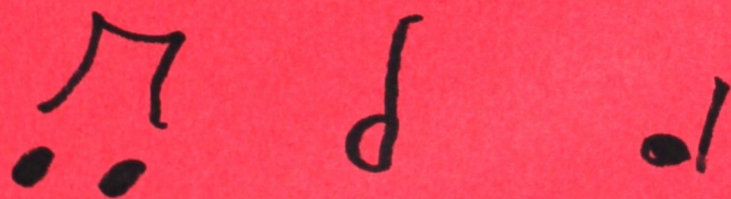

Dear Runoia Parents,

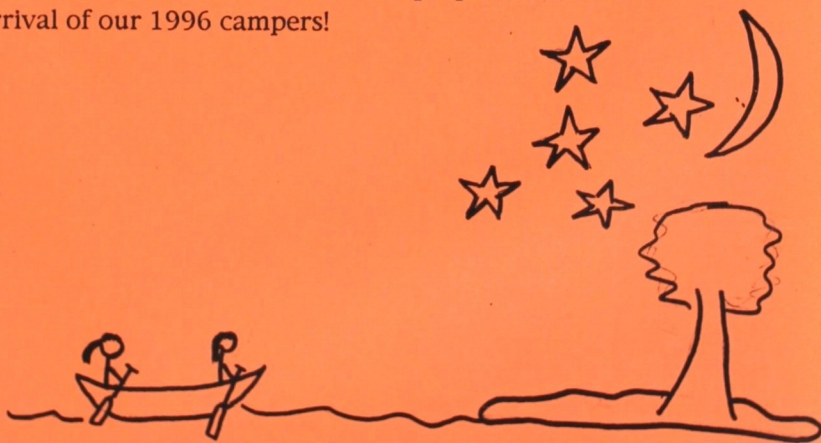



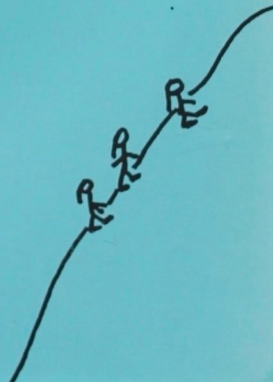
This week we've had a treasure hunt, played the laundry bag game, learned social dancing (yes, even the Tango), and had the Miss Tacky Runoia contest.

Well, we've had another fun-packed week here at Runoia.

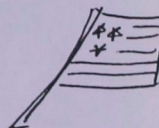



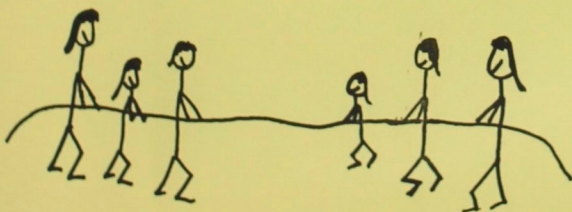
Like most other places in New England, we didn't see the fireworks until the 5th due to bad weather. But they were as big and spectacular as ever.


