Cassi Reid

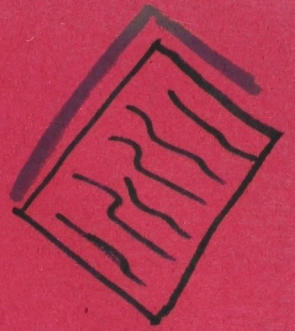

Prince: Who said anything about marriage? I would never marry a bossy woman like you! I just need a kiss to break the spell.

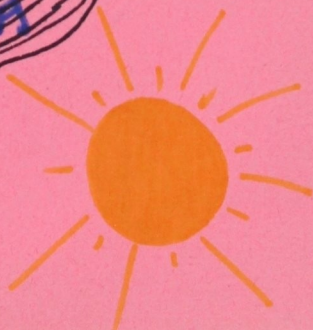
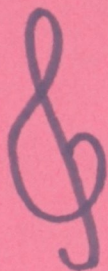
Princess: As far as I'm concerned, one less lazy Prince in the world the better!

Fun and laughter is sure to continue throughout the second half of the session.

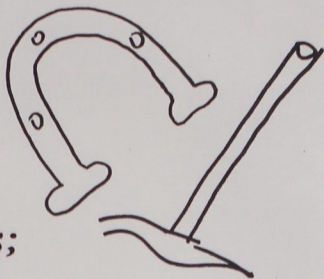
