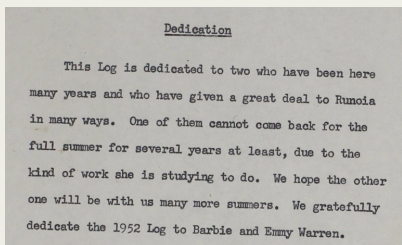


1942

1942: The Warren family of Waterville begins a long association with Camp Runoia. Mrs. Warren (Eleanor, or Ellie) and her two daughters, Barbara and Emily, spent their first of 13 summers on Great Pond. Mrs. Warren ran the kitchen; Barbara (Barbie) was in fourth shack; younger sister Emily (Emmy) was in third. Mr. Warren (Elmer) was serving in World War II, but after the war spent some time on Great Pond as well.



Barbie (above left) became a counselor in 1948. (Claire Rothenberg is to her right.) Mrs. Warren was still making her famous graham cracker pie. The log was dedicated to her in 1950. The 1952 log was dedicated to both Barbie and Emmy (see photo to left); 1954 was the family's last summer at camp, although they stayed close to Miss Weiser for years to come.
