Hello from Great Pond from Camp Director, Alex Jackson!



The slow creep of spring has us excited for the rapidly approaching summer season. We cannot wait to start our 117th season of Runoia. After a successful, transitional winter preparations for the summer are in full swing. The year-round team is looking forward to the arrival of our seasonal staff starting at the end of May. We will welcome counselors and staff from all over the US, Mexico, England, Scotland, Australia, Germany, and Ireland. The eclectic mix of people and exchange of cultures makes camp a vibrant community to grow in.

What's to see in 2023?

- Over by the Cottage, The Berry Patch has been under construction through the winter and will provide us with flexible staff housing. These 3 mini cabins, like last year's addition of Pincushion for the CITS, help us to have additional housing options for families and staff.
- The popularity of Harmony Land Camp led to us adding an extra session this summer. We still have a few spots open for our youngest campers to get a taste of camp life.
- For our equestrian lovers we will have a one week
 riding intensive program after camp. This new riding program will encourage campers aged
 12-17 of all experience and abilities to enjoy camp time focused on riding skill development
 and horse care.
- Upgrades in maintenance and in the kitchen, the new trip shack, on-demand hot water at the Junior Soapies (no need to run for first showers anymore!) and other improvements and investments for now and for the future are ongoing.

How CRAO impacts lives:

We are grateful for the continued generosity of the CRAO. This summer donations will provide camperships for 18 campers and 11 with riding lessons. We are excited about new SWAG (stuff we all give) initiative ensuring campers on camperships have the supplies that they need to have an amazing summer at camp. We also have about 25 alumnae connected campers joining us in 2023: continuing their family tradition of Runoia summers through generations.

How amazing that your dedication to the Runoia Camp experience continues to provide campers with unplugged time in nature, new opportunities, lifelong friendships, and summer memories to last a lifetime.


Congratulations to **Kristen Nocka** who graduated from Yale School of Nursing May 2023 after completing her Master of Public Health from Boston University.


