The generosity of the CRAO is set to impact 15 campers by providing camperships, and 11 campers by providing riding lessons. Runoia has formed new partnerships to expand the reach of donations, including Maine's Level Ground, which serves to provide tuition to Maine's immigrant and refugee families who otherwise would not be able to attend camp. Camp is positively impacted by its socioeconomic diversity in made possible by the CRAO - we are stronger and more vibrant with these campers in our family.




