



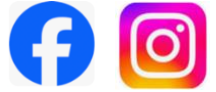

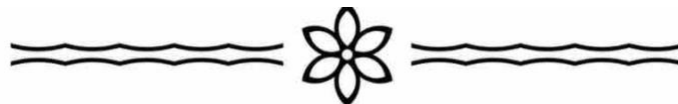

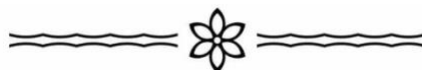
Note from the President - Spring 2026

120 – OH, HERE WE COME!!!!

As the 120th Anniversary celebration draws nearer, there is another “120” that we are also looking forward to celebrating.

Following the last Reunion in 2022, the Camp Runoia Alumnae Organization immediately set our sights on the 120th celebration. In order to recognize that milestone year, we set an ambitious – goal for the CRAO to raise \$120,000 in new gifts for the Betty Cobb Memorial Campership. Thanks to the continued generosity of Alumnae, parents of Runoia campers, and other friends, **we are in the homestretch of that goal.**

Here are some facts:

- **The CRAO is an independent non-profit whose sole mission is to raise Camperships funds.**
- **As a volunteer-driven organization, the CRAO has minimal overhead expenses. Contributions go directly to Camperships, providing Campers’ families with financial support.**
- **Since the CRAO began providing Campership support to Runoia in 1987, approximately 425 camper summers have been provided for campers needing financial assistance.**
- **Last summer, the CRAO donated \$80,000 for Camperships -- \$75,000 in general support through the Betty Cobb Memorial Campership Fund and \$5,000 through the Pam Cobb Equestrian Fund. This will enable approximately two dozen campers to experience Runoia this summer.**

The CRAO’s contributions to Runoia are made through a conservative draw on the endowment, and annual donations. Our ultimate goal is to grow the endowment enough that Camperships can be fully supported with its proceeds. Presently about half of the CRAO’s contribution to Runoia comes from endowment income, so until such time as the endowment grows significantly, we must rely on the willing support of our Alumnae, parents, and friends to continue to meet the full financial need of campers’ families.

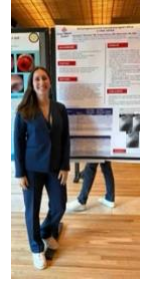

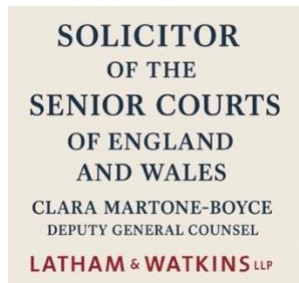

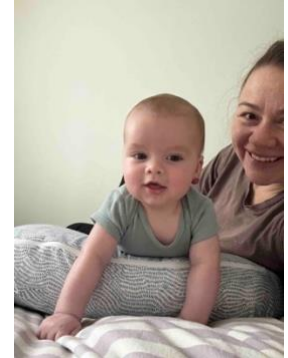

Dear CRAO,

I was a camper at Runoia from 1994 through 1997 and those summers were, without a doubt, the best summers of my life. My grandmother was a firm believer in the value of



summer camp, and she supported my ability to do so. My grandmother would drive me from my home in New Hampshire to camp and we would sing camp songs all the way.

To this day, I stay in touch with women I met at Runoia. My memories of those summers are so powerful that I can still recite the limericks my counselors wrote for me at our farewell campfire ("Taylor is our kayaking queen; on the water, her spirit is keen...") I remember all of the words to the songs we sang every campfire. I remember Soapies in the lake, and how Pam and Diane would come through the shacks every night to tuck each of us in. I remember the fluffy biscuits in the Dining Hall that I loved. And

I remember how much fun we had coordinating the lip-sync

competitions and "Miss Tacky Runoia". Runoia was the first place I ever rode a horse. There was a horse there I loved named Magic, and I

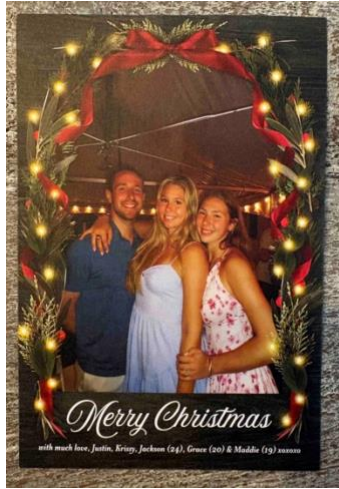
remember one summer, a professional singer/songwriter spent a week with us at camp and offered a singer-songwriter workshop. She was Pam's friend, [Robin Lane](#). I took the workshop, wrote a song about Magic the horse, and a couple of months later, I received a cassette tape in the mail. Robin Lane (the) had recorded all of our songs in a studio, including mine! I listened to that tape of all our songs (it was called "Little Birds Grow Up") over and over. I know I don't have to convince you that Runoia is a special place, but I hope to convey to you how incredibly formative it was for me. Runoia was a place where I always felt like I belonged and where I felt free to be myself. I grew so much there. I made lifelong connections. I developed values that have shaped who I am today. I am grateful for my daughter to experience Runoia too. (photo right)
